



GOSPEL MUSIC HISTORY COURSE ON ZOOM AT FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH UCC, SOUTH PORTLAND

This 8-week free offering on Zoom to church members and friends will explore gospel hymns and songs from the Christian tradition, both from white and black gospel perspectives. You'll learn the history of well known pieces as well as ones you've never heard, and experience the music by hearing it on piano and via lots of videos. You can even sing along at home. Song sheets for each session will be provided by email which you can refer to and/or print. Class members will be encouraged to ask questions and to have discussion. If you miss a session, teaching notes and video links will be sent via email so you can stay up to date with others. At least 6 enrollments are necessary for this course to take place.
