

# Vice Moderator Update...

# Electronic Giving

All E-Givers should have received a letter from me a week ago letting you know that E-Giving will be turned off in the very near future. The system has been randomly failing which has impacted our financial statements.

In the letter I asked each individual who currently is signed up for e-giving through First Parish and Saco Biddeford Savings Bank to implement Auto-Pay from your bank account where you direct your bank to send a check to First Parish. Some parishioners will know how to do this, but for those that do not, please contact your bank or credit union's customer service agent for assistance. I have spoken to each bank and credit union, and their customer assistance associates are ready and willing to assist.

I plan to turn off e-Giving at Saco Biddeford Savings on June 15, 2022.

Many have called the church asking how they catch up. I would recommend simply sending a check to the church with a note that this is a catch-up check and the counters will record the information.

We are very sorry for the challenges this is bringing everyone, but hopefully will be resolved in the next month.

At the Annual Affirmation Meeting held on January 23, we as a church body approved the 2022 Mission Plan. As you may remember, this budget projected income of \$340,099 and expenses of \$450,960. We were able to approve a budget with an expected shortfall (or loss) of \$110,861 because the checking account Operating balance had grown to \$207,734 as of December 31, 2021. The Operating balance grew to this amount because we have had several years where income exceeded expenses and the surplus or "carryover" grew that Operating balance account.

We have financial reports through April as of this writing, so with four months behind us let's look at how we are performing against the budget with one-third of the year passed.

Budgeted income through April stands at \$98,879. This is actually below our targeted income of \$113,366. Some of this reduced income may be because the e-giving system went down in early March so many pledge payments for March and April were not made. Pledges are under budget by \$6,429 through April. Church rentals and loose cash and checks are also under budget, which may reflect that our budgeting for those accounts was optimistic. We hope to see increased rental and loose cash and check income as the year progresses.

Budgeted expenses through April stand at \$130,646. This is fortunately also below our targeted expenses of \$150,320. Many teams are being prudent in their spending to accomplish this, using Legacy and rolling funds when possible. Teams are obtaining competitive quotes and finding savings through new vendors (thanks Facilities!). Personnel is underbudget in part because the new IT position has not been filled yet.

Through April, expenses exceed income by \$31,767. The checking account Operating balance has been reduced to cover this shortfall.

What can we do? If your teams can continue to be good stewards, this will help expenses stay below budget. Please spend rolling or Legacy funds when possible and make prudent purchasing decisions. If you are behind on pledge payments and are able to catch-up, thank you! We also have an exciting Concert Series scheduled that may bring in more community members from outside of the church. We may need to explore more future activities that may generate more visibility and income for FPC later in 2022 and future years.

Dear family and friends of First Parish,

We hope you have picked up on the positive "vibes" pervading First Parish in recent weeks. We are in many ways back to "normal" ...even having small coffee hours after worship! Our membership numbers are increasing and we continue to minister to the community as well as our own family.

The Deacons, at the request of the Church Council, have been engaging in discussions around how we can do more to enhance our ministry. Among the things we'd like to do, indeed things we think we should be doing: generating fellowship opportunities and prayer groups, encouraging adult Christian education and study groups, developing sub-committees for home visits, and so much more.

As a team, we are hampered by our very limited numbers. Long-serving deacons have "retired" and we find ourselves struggling to serve in the most basic deacon roles. We recently welcomed five new members, but we would like to add at least five more. If you've ever thought about becoming a deacon, this might be a good time to investigate and consider.

In our church, the deacons' stated mission is to assist the senior minister in the spiritual life of the church. You have probably observed that we regularly help prepare the sanctuary for worship and serve as the welcoming face of First Parish. But our public role is only part of what we would like to do. Thus, the need for a few more deacons!

Who should be a deacon? No special skills are needed, but prospective deacons should have a dedicated commitment to First Parish. Deacons are expected to serve regularly at Sunday services and to attend a monthly meeting (currently held on the third Wednesday evening of each month.) It is hoped that the prospective deacon will have a spiritual mindset; in any event, serving as a deacon often results in significant spiritual growth.

If you feel that this ministry would be a good fit for you as a church member, we encourage you to reach out to Pastor Scott or to one of the current deacons. We would love to talk to you about it!


The month of June brings us sunshine and a chance to renew our mind, soul and body. It is a more relaxing and playful time. Church school age level classes are over for the



#### **ATTENTION KNITTERS AND CROCHETERS!**

<u>HAT NOT HATE</u> is an anti-bullying campaign. They ask knitters, crocheters and loomers to make handmade blue hats and donate them to their cause. If you can make a blue hat or two, please bring them to our church by **JULY 15** or the hats may be delivered to Knit Wit, 34 Danforth St, Portland, ME by August 1. Visit <a href="https://hatnothate.org">hatnothate.org</a> for more information.

What is #HATNOTHATE? #HATNOTHATE was launched in 2018 as an anti-bullying campaign founded by Shira Blumenthal. We encourage people to make, wear, and post handmade blue hats, adding #HATNOTHATE when sharing on social platforms. Hats are distributed to schools nationwide, educating students about the message of kindness.

Why do the hats need to be blue? The color blue represents awareness, peace, and solidarity. Blue is the color to wear in support of anti-bullying.

What are the requirements for the blue hats I want to donate? As we are looking to fit a wide range of sizes (for ages 5 to 18), most hat sizes are appropriate, i.e. ranging from 16 inches to 20 inches in circumference. Close-fitting beanie style as well as slouchy style hats are welcome. Hats should be handmade using any blue yarn and should be at least 75% blue.

Who receives the blue hats that are donated? We will give the donated blue hats to select schools from around the country, all of which are participating in National Bullying Prevention Month throughout the month of October.


