



# The Pastor's Perspective ...



Two months ago, I shared a few of my dreams, or areas of emphasis for the coming year. At our March Church Council meeting, I was asked to share the entire list. Here it is. If you see something that interests you, please let me know. If you see something that sparks an idea in your head or in your heart, let me know. My hope is that we can continue to create a vision for our life and ministry here at First Parish Church.

#### Worship:

Increase worship participation. Invite more members (children, youth and adults) to assist with worship leadership as readers, etc.

"Quiet Worship" – develop and offer worship services for those with PTSD or trauma, those who are noise or crowd reactive. Offer a quiet, non-threatening, non-reactive worship experience.

Dementia-friendly worship – develop and offer services for those with dementia and for their caregivers.

#### **Invitation/Evangelism:**

Encourage members to invite a friend to worship and other events at the church.

Social Media Sundays – encourage people to post or share what is happening at that moment on their social media platforms. "Share the Secret" campaign.

Community Engagement – strengthen our connections with Saco Main Street and Heart of Biddeford. Encourage more participation and visibility in community events.

#### Fellowship: Engagement and Integration:

Offer new member gatherings at the church and at people's homes.

Offer more fellowship gatherings for ALL to participate. Good News Team has started creating a list of fellowship activities.

Offer regular "Lunch with Pastor" and "Dinner with Pastor" opportunities.

#### **Christian Education/Spiritual Development:**

Explore new opportunities for adults to explore and deepen their faith through Bible study and discussion groups.

Offer a spirituality retreat for the church family.

#### **Teams/Business:**

Recruitment for teams. Consider repopulating the Nominating Team to help encourage people to join teams. Also, Team Celebration Sunday – "job" fair.

Plan "All Committee Nights" at which all members of all teams come together to coordinate, plan and brainstorm. At least once a year.

Long Range Planning Retreat – visioning and dreaming. What does First Parish Church look like? How do we get there?

"Dancing into Joy!" engaging and interactive worship service on Sunday after Easter (April 16) Will include the creation of a Wall of Ideas.

I look forward to hearing your thoughts and ideas!



#### **Vice Moderator Update**

Easter is almost here!! We get to hear and teach our children the story of the Risen Lord. This is such a joyful story in the end, but such a challenging story before Easter.

I love this time of year with the flowers blossoming, the glorious warming of the weather, and getting to see our Florida friends once again.

We continue to look for a person to take on the Moderator role. If you have an interest, you can speak to Scott or myself at any time. The Moderator guides the ship in a business sense. Checks need to be signed (with the help of others), contracts need to be reviewed and signed, and coordination amongst teams take place.

March has been a busy month working with different teams. We again thank Marianne Cook for compiling the teams accomplishments. I will make the list available at the back of the sanctuary so you can pick up a copy to know what your fellow church members are currently working on.

The Finance Team is working with the Investment Team to get better interest return on our checking account balance. Currently we get .4% on the balance with the local bank. By working with the Investment Team, we can move the majority of the money to an FDIC-Insured money market and get around 4.25 - 4.5 % interest. We would earn about \$10k -\$12K in interest, instead of a few hundred dollars. The goal is to help offset our revenue/budget shortfall. Remember that our budget is mostly salary and facility costs, which do not give us much wiggle room to reduce costs.

Facilities, Top Of The Hill Gang, and I have been looking for documentation for the halogen light fixture in the atrium and ultimately in the sanctuary. We would like to change the halogen light bulbs to LED bulbs without tearing out the fixtures.

I thank all members of the church for showing care with shutting lights off and using smaller rooms when the Atrium space is not necessary. We are seeing a difference in our electric bill! John Brockington is working to get a better commercial electricity rate from CMP. Commercial rates are set by CMP electricity based on the volume of that day. CMP sets Sunday as the day to set rates for most churches. Sunday is our largest usage day (making the rate higher), and the entire week is based on Sunday's rate. John has been trying to negotiate a rate change.

On another front, a group has met with Revision Energy to get a Solar Energy plan. There are several options to fund this, but first an inquiry is being made to the town to see if our church can install panels on our roof, as the church is in Saco's Historic District (so best to check before we get too far).

Finally, Scott is planning a service looking at the future and adding to the Wall of Ideas. We want to know what you like, and also what you would like to see more of. Keep your eyes and ears open for this coming event!

I am enjoying attending both the 8AM early service, and of course, the 10AM service on Sundays, and glad to see the crowd grow each week. I hope to see you in church, especially Easter Sunday!! Let the trumpets sound!!

served for 6 years. Jean then rejoined the Diaconate a year ago. Besides serving as a Deacon,


























# **Music and Arts Update...**

#### **Mission Team**

What is the purpose of the mission Team? Our goal is to do what we can in response to the needs of our local community and the world as Jesus Christ has encouraged us to do by His example. This mission is accomplished in part through hands-on local work, and financial support.

**Who are the members of the group?** Carol SpencerLemay (chair), Lorie Faubert, Jane Kircher, Joan Sonnenborn, and Trina Triggs. In addition, many members of our church are involved with outreach work and do not attend our meetings.

**When does the team meet?** We meet on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm in the First Parish Congregational Church Parlor.

What local missions are supported by the team? We have provided volunteers and funds to Bon Appetit, which is a free weeknight meal program located at Second Congregational Church, Biddeford. We solicit donations of shoes and socks, and give them away to those in need. We advertise the needs of the Saco Food Pantry, and one of our members volunteers there. We are involved with helping on MLK day of service and organize the August Back to School Giveaway. We have donated to Seeds of Hope, and Welcome In our new Neighbors. We also try to support the church's Diaper Bank that is under the direction of Pam Mohlin. We are sponsoring the Red Cross Blood Drive April 22. Recently we showed the movie, Who We Are: A Chronicle of Racism in America in honor of Black History Month. Trina Triggs is organizing the "Called to Care" initiative, in which volunteers visit the shut-ins of our community.

What other missions does the team support? We advertise *Daisy's Children*, which is a program that feeds children in a small town in Honduras. With Women's Fellowship, we plan to co-sponsor the luncheon to advertise H.E.A.L. which supports an orphanage in Kenya, Africa. We advertise the United Church of Christ's special collections, which are known as "5 for 5" offerings, and this is not all!


