






New Member Information Classes


Winter Book Retreat Ten Evenings With God, by Ilia Delio

Pastor Scott's Message...

The Pastor's Perspective ...

I would like to begin this month by offering my sincere gratitude to Dale Siulinski for his service as our Moderator for the last two years. The global pandemic and the associated challenges have not been easy to navigate, but Dale did a wonderful job of guiding us through. I wish Dale and Lynne well as they enjoy some much-deserved time in the warmth and sunshine of Florida.

Speaking of Dale ... at our last Church Council meeting, he included an item on the agenda that read: "Consider what is important to Scott. What are you dreaming about?" At the Annual Affirmation Meeting on Sunday, I told you that I have a list of things that I would like to focus upon in the coming year. Let me share a couple of those items with you.

Worship: In the area of our worship services I would like to encourage increased participation from the members of our church family. I would love to have more people ... young and older ... serve as liturgists and readers. I would love to include people in skits or drama that will help to open up the scripture readings or illumine the morning message. (I should not be the only one that gets to wear costumes.) I would love to have people make loaves of bread for communion Sundays. In addition, I am exploring the possibility of offering "quiet" worship services for veterans and others that suffer with PTSD. For those with PTSD, or other anxiety disorders, the crowds and the volume of a traditional worship service can be overwhelming. As I have done some initial investigation, I have not seen any churches in the area that offer quiet worship services.

Invitation: Some people struggle with the word "evangelism," so let us use a different word ... invitation. Let us focus upon getting the word out and sharing what is happening here at First Parish Church. We live in one of the most unchurched regions of the country. How do we invite people to come and experience all of our wonderful ministries? How do we engage with the wider community? How do we become a gathering place for our neighbors? Every Sunday is "invite a friend" Sunday, but perhaps we can seek ways to be more intentional about that. Perhaps we could encourage "Social Media Sundays" when those who are active on various platforms share what is happening here at the church. Perhaps we could encourage greater involvement and participation with Saco Main Street and The Heart of Biddeford.

Engagement and Integration: How do we get to know one another better? How do we get to know the new members and how do they get to know those who have been here for a while? Attending worship is an important part of life in our church family, but how can we feel like we are "family" if we do not know one another? We are going to continue with our Common Table gatherings that we began last year. In addition, we will offer new member gatherings both here at the church and at people's homes. And in addition to that, we will be planning monthly "Lunch with Pastor" and "Dinner with Pastor" events that will better enable me to hear and learn your stories. In fact, we put the first one on the church calendar. **Please join me for lunch here at the church on Sunday, March 19.** There will be a sign-up sheet in the office so that I will know how many we will be serving.

That is just one page from my List of Dreams. Do any of them speak to you? Do any of them pique your interest? Do you have any ideas of your own? Let me know. This is a community project. I would like to get you all involved.



Moderator Update

From the Moderator...



Another Annual Affirmation Meeting is in the books where we as a church body review and affirm everything we accomplished in the previous year, approve the Mission Plan and look to the coming year. We limited the meeting to in-person attendance this year. A personal touch is always preferred where you get to experience human emotion regarding the challenges we face and see where people's hearts truly dwell. The attendance was excellent and we attained a quorum easily. Thanks to all who participated.

One of the key outcomes from the meeting was to affirm the need for improved cohesion. You may recall that in previous years the Church Council embarked on performing an assessment to ensure that our organization and processes are optimized in order to capitalize on the great work of the church, ensuring that we are all working towards a common goal. While the work performed by each of the teams is impressive, their work is often siloed, where a joint effort may yield improved results. You have heard me speak of an Ad Hoc team known as the Organizational Governance Structure Team. This team met and reviewed the current governance structure which was put in place ten years ago. That structure designates sub-groups or ministries of the Church Council: Worship Ministry, Discipleship/Fellowship Ministry, and the Asset Ministry, with each of the 18 teams falling under one of those three ministries. A liaison from the Church Council is designated to work with each of those ministries to promote communication. However, it was recognized that over the years, this structure has not worked well and the team felt that reenergizing those ministries is not exciting. The Organizational Structure Team recognized that the Ministry structure should be replaced with another system. Therefore, the team recommended a new process where all team chairpersons attend the Church Council meeting quarterly to foster bidirectional communication. Teams could learn what's going on at the Council level, and the Council could receive their requests for any assistance. This would replace the Council liaison position that's part of the current ministry governance structure. Additionally, the Organizational Structure Team recommended that each team should issue three bullets to foster communication, including but not limited to: What is your team doing? What is your team most proud of? What does your team need help with? This process does not involve a change to the bylaws therefore it has already started. Marianne Cook, Church Clerk, will issue a reminder to team chairpersons each month in 2023 to offer their three bullets of information for distribution to all team chairpersons. Another recommendation that came out of the team meetings was to do something called a "wall of ideas" at some point in 2023 where people would record concerns or initiatives they are considering on a post-it note and place it on a wall, for review and discussion by all. You voted to affirm the Organizational team's recommendations. This will promote our true objective which is to covenant with one another and our community.

As I indicated previously, I am stepping down as your Moderator. I can't thank you enough for your engagement and support over the last couple of years. Your energy clearly demonstrates that you care deeply. First Parish is truly a church with love and hope to share.



Martin Luther King Day of Service January 16, 2023



Not A Day Off, But A Day On

Life's most urgent question is? "What are you doing for others?" -Martin Luther King

The weather outside was frightful but the time inside delightful.... Yes, once again, we had a snowy, sleety day for our 15th annual MLK Day of Service. With the help of over 40 volunteers we served 102 people, including 10 families. Our clients came from our tri city area of Saco, Biddeford and OOB but also from as far north as Portland. west as Alfred and south as Kennebunk. Our shoe ministry gave away over 125 pairs of shoes/boots. Our three hairdressers did

24 haircuts, with 24 head checks, and our medical students took 10 blood pressures. We helped 3 families with laundry and provided a hot breakfast, of eggs, fruit and muffins and a hot lunch, of chop suey, veggie and white bean chili or vegetable soup. We gave away a tremendous amount of warm clothing, new underwear, bras and socks. There were bins full of toiletries, shampoo, soap, toothpaste and toothbrushes and much more. We gave away free books for children and adults and a few games. Our Diaper Bank handed out 32 bags of diapers. People were as grateful as ever. Thank you to our two therapy dogs, Professor and Scotch. It would not be MLK day without you both. Thank you to Sue Burgess and the food crew. Thank you to all who helped sort and organize. Thank you to everyone that help set up the sanctuary after the Sunday service. Thank you to all those who donated items. Thank you to everyone who helped clean up. A big shout out to our custodian Guy, who could have had a day off but choose to spend it with us. Thank you to our dozen youth who helped serve food, shovel and clean up afterwards. We did all of this with a smile on our faces and a compassionate heart. Another great quote from MLK is this:

"Everybody can be great ... because anybody can serve. You don't have to have a college degree to serve. You don't have to make your subject and verb agree to serve. You only need a heart full of grace. A soul generated by love."

The Investment Team manages the endowment portfolio of the Church and administers all bequests, trusts, legacies and other funds in strict compliance with the terms of the bequest in a way to facilitate the stated purpose and goals of the Church. The current restricted legacy funds support; Music & Arts, Mission, Christian Education, Flower & Altar, Building Administration and the Johnson Atkinson Spiritual Growth Fund. The remaining funds are unrestricted and support the Church's annual operating budget.

We meet with an independent financial advisor once or twice a year to review the status of the portfolio's stocks, bonds and cash accounts to ensure they are inline with the current and future needs of the church. The team may also meet during the year to discuss current issues and provide financial updates to Council and the congregation members. It is a great opportunity to get to know about the financial matters of the Church, keep it on a steady course to ensure sustainability and growth and be part of a great group of people. 
