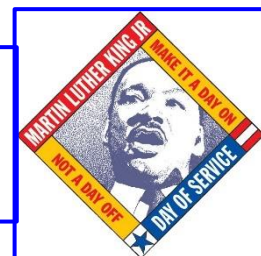

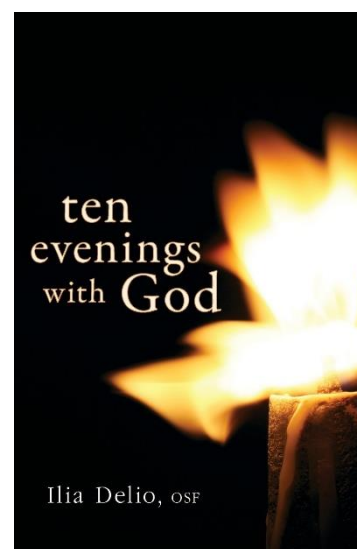
### Winter Book Retreat Ten Evenings With God, by Ilia Delio

**First:** To receive a statement and a prayer by our Minister, Rev. Scott Cousineau.

**Second:** To receive information and take action, if required, on the reports of the various officers and teams of the church, specifically:

## **Pastor Scott's Message...**

### **The Pastor's Perspective ...**



I am not much of a "Car Guy." I mean ... I love cars. They make getting around town so much faster and easier. But I can only perform the most basic repairs and maintenance on my vehicles. I tried to change my own oil one time and ended up with hair filled with filthy, old motor oil. (Expert's tip: When draining motor oil, make sure that your head is NOT in the catch basin.) I do enjoy watching auto renovation and restoration programs on television. I enjoy watching the transformation of a rusty "barn find" into a restored gem. Watching those shows has taught me how many systems in automobiles operate. Not enough to know how to replace or repair them, but enough to know how things work.

Recently, I have been thinking about torque converters. Now ... stay with me here. Those of us who drive automobiles with an automatic transmission use them every day. Did you know that? The torque converter is that piece of equipment that transfers the power from the engine to the drive shaft and ultimately to the wheels. Step on the gas pedal and the car accelerates. Take our foot off and it decelerates. Smooth and simple. We do not even think about it.

Now ... what on earth does this have to do with you, us, and the church? Good question.

Over the past few months, we have steadily emerged from the specter of COVID. Our worship attendance has been increasing week after week. On Christmas Eve, we welcomed over three hundred and fifty worshippers at our two worship services. We have felt the spirit and the energy return to our sanctuary. We have seen friends return and also many new faces. The 8:00 AM worship service has returned. Our Senior Choir averages nearly thirty people every Sunday. The children and youth for our Children's Messages now sometimes occupy three pews! Our Sunday school attendance is also increasing. All of those are wonderful trends. It is so exciting to spend Sunday mornings here at First Parish Church!

Now for the "torque" converter, or in this case, a "Spirit" converter. How do we transfer the power and spirit that we experience in worship and Sunday school into meaningful ministry?

Worship and teaching are essential parts of our ministry. They are the foundation upon which we build. But Jesus barely speaks of worship in his ministry. Instead, his emphasis is loving one another and serving our neighbors. He asks us to consider the important questions: 'How do you love?' and 'Who do you love?'

As we begin a new year, let us spend some time focusing upon these questions, and the additional questions that arise from them. How to engage those who are part of our church family? How do we encourage participation in our church leadership and ministries? How to engage the wider community? How do we establish and build deeper relationships? How do we serve our neighbors? And even more ... how do we hear and learn their stories? When we say, "All are welcome here." do we really mean it? Let us ponder these questions in our hearts.

# Moderator Update

## From the Moderator...



Welcome 2023! A new year always offers a time for reflection as well as new hope. People use the new year to change some aspect of their lives that they are not satisfied with or does not bring them the happiness they seek. The key is to identify facets that need improvement, and then set goals that are realistically achievable with appropriate effort and put a mechanism in place that encourages one to continue in that effort to ensure success. You also need a few "wins" to provide incentive to continue. First Parish Church is in a similar position. We face some significant challenges as we enter 2023. As you've heard me say prior to worship every week during our Generosity Campaign, we have some considerable budget challenges going into 2023 so we need everybody's input to help reach a resolution that is best for all. The budget requested by all the teams now sits at \$422K. However, at the time of this writing, the total amount pledged for 2023 is \$275K, well short of our target goal. Whereas some of the teams have already cut their budgets, we need to employ a multi-pronged strategy which includes rental income, fundraising and budget cuts in order to fund our programs. Additionally, at the recommendation of the Finance Team, the Church Council reviewed and discussed these strategies as well as using teams "rolling funds" or monies that are from contributions from members or individual gifts at our November and December meetings. All avenues will continue to be reviewed in order to present a realistic budget.

Congregational budget meetings are planned for after worship on Jan 8 and 15, 2023 in order to review and discuss the 2023 Mission Plan. Your participation is needed this year. We need everybody's thoughts, ideas, creativity and energy to come up with a way to continue to fund the wonderful initiatives of First Parish church for 2023. Annual Affirmation is Sunday, January 22, 2023 with a snow date of January 29. Please join us after worship for this important meeting. Look for the Call soon. Per our By Laws, we need a quorum for the meeting to take place.

Finally, I'll be stepping down as your Moderator at the Annual Affirmation meeting. Moderator is a wonderful role where you get to affect change and be involved in many interesting and important aspects of church business. It's an awesome task to facilitate Church Council meetings. It's simultaneously energizing and exhausting. I have been humbled and honored to fulfill this role over the last couple years. First Parish is and always has been in good hands. There are many people whom I would like to thank. The staff at First Parish church is truly exceptional. They are truly talented and devoted to the purpose and mission of our church and community. They have made my job enjoyable and much easier. Additionally, there are many volunteers who work tirelessly to support First Parish. When I see what people do, it makes me want to work even harder. Please continue to support your new Moderator, who will be announced at the Annual Meeting.

# From the TREASURER

At the Annual Affirmation Meeting held on January 23, 2022 we as a church body approved the 2022 Mission Plan. As you may remember, this budget projected income of \$340,099 and expenses of \$450,960. We were able to approve a budget with an expected shortfall (or loss) of \$110,861 because the checking account Operating balance had grown to \$207,734 as of December 31, 2021. The Operating balance grew to this amount because we have had several years where income exceeded expenses and the surplus or “carryover” grew that Operating balance account.

We have financial reports through November and activity for three weeks in December as of this writing, so let’s look at how we are performing against the budget with most of the year passed.

Budgeted income through December 22 stands at \$342,649. This is above our targeted annual income of \$340,099. Budgeted expenses through December 22 stand at \$398,699. This is below our budgeted expenses of \$450,960. The resulting deficit for 2022 through December 22 is \$56,050. This deficit is being funded by the surplus in the checking account Operating balance from prior years. The operating balance stands at roughly \$150,000 as of December 22.

First Parish Church income from pledges averaged \$274,640 over 2016-2021, ranging from \$255,680 to 293,192. Pledges through December 22, 2022 total \$251,662 so we are not looking as though we will hit that average for 2022.

Looking at next year’s budget, pledges received for 2023 total \$274,850 through December 22, 2022. Total 2023 budgeted income is \$347,990.

The 2023 budget requests from teams initially totaled \$453,603. Over the last month teams have revised their budget and the revised budget requests total \$422,109. The budgeted requests for 2023 for Personnel totals \$268,674 and Facilities totals \$112,320; all other teams requests combined total \$41,115.

The current 2023 budget draft has a \$74,119 shortfall. Our budgeted income only covers 82% of our budgeted expenses.

We can’t use up the entire \$150,000 surplus in the operating balance with successive years of expenses exceeding income. First Parish Church had budgeted expenses every month of over \$33,000 for 2022; 2023 projected monthly expenses are currently over \$35,000. Most businesses, non-profits and governments keep two months or more of planned expenses in their checking accounts so that they can pay bills and payroll timely, which suggest FPC should keep \$70,000 or more in its operating account.

The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) funds and the Saco School rentals provided extra income to First Parish Church totaling \$121,600 over 2019-2021. Those revenues are not coming back. We need to either develop additional revenue sources or reduce expenses (and services) at First Parish Church.

First Parish Church should re-visit its organizational structure and bylaws as part of the process to address the budget shortfalls which are likely to continue for the foreseeable future without changes to increase revenues or cut expenses.

I urge you to get involved and volunteer in 2023. We are going to need people to possibly help with fundraising, church rentals, bylaws and organizational structure, and budgeting for 2024 and beyond.



# Deacon Ministry

As an active member, Pam has served the Diaconate for a number of terms throughout the years, in addition to serving in the nursery, on the Christian Education Team, Nominating Committee, Capital Campaign, and the Open and Affirming Committee. She has also created the Diaper Bank mission at First Parish, and is currently the coordinator for this highly needed and used, organization for families in Saco and the surrounding communities.



Upon being initially asked by a former minister to serve as a Deacon, Pam felt called to accept, after serious consideration. At that time, women had only recently joined the Diaconate.

Pam considers being a Deacon to be the most meaningful role she's had at First Parish. Being a member of the Diaconate has led to the church becoming an extension of Pam's family, providing support, and many close friendships. 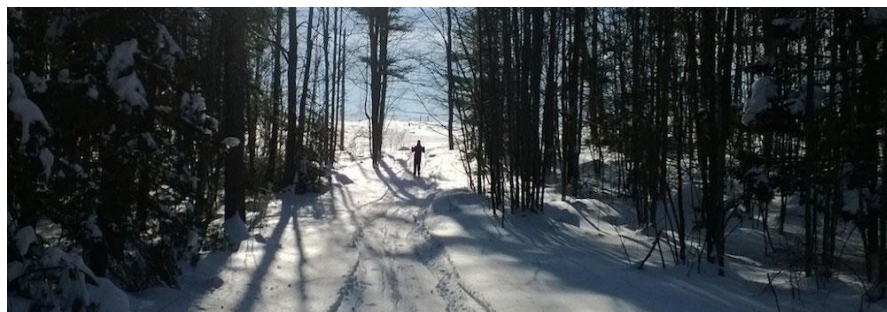
