Moderator Update

Greetings church family!

I hope you have all had a wonderful summer full of sunshine and many blessings. Regrettably, my Messenger input this month is in the form of my resignation as FPC Moderator. Last week, I was notified that my Afghan Air Force Officer Colleague, friend, and dear brother and his family were pulled into the "safe zone" at Kabul Airport by an incredible U.S. Marine. Me and a very small "pick up team" of people from my network over the years worked a plan and I was in awe watching just a few amazing Americans make it happen. Watching this team, I observed everything that is good about America. I was on my knees praying to God like I never had before, along with many of you and those around the country and observed God's amazing power. The way the planets aligned on this were only due to God's divine intervention and He led us every step of the way.

So, why do I need to resign? As I write this, my Afghan Brother, Hakim, and his family are currently safely on the ground at Washington Dulles Airport. They decided that they want to be near me and Eddie. He considers me a sister and knows that his wife, daughter, and two daughters-in-law will be most comfortable with us helping them. Hakim fought his whole life for a better Afghanistan and future for his children and he is heartbroken. Hakim is very well educated, and he saw to it that his children were as well. Over the past 20 years, his oldest son became a civil engineer, his middle son & middle son's wife became medical doctors, his daughter became a history teacher, and his youngest son is top of his class and would have been entering the 12th grade this year. There are 11 in the family, including three small grandchildren. I am working with an extensive network to prepare for their arrival and everything that will be required to support them. This could literally take years and it has already consumed most of my time this past two weeks. It is critically important to get this right and I believe this is what I am currently called to do.

I am not one to break my commitments, but I just won't have the capacity to provide the time, focus, and leadership that FPC deserves as Moderator going forward. For the remainder of this year, our Vice Moderator Dale Siulinski has graciously agreed to fill the role of Moderator and the council is currently coordinating for an interim Vice Moderator in accordance with our First Parish Church Bylaws. I will continue to assist the council where I can, but I must step down from the lead as I simply won't have the capacity to effectively carry out the duties of moderator. Your FPC council has begun some important work this year and I know that will continue.

Thanks so much for all you do! I love this church family and am grateful for your understanding.

- 5. Helps us to know if there are parents wanting their children Baptized



school families and our congregation to donate. As of Aug. 25th, 10,480 diapers have been distributed to the tri-town community since the programs start on May 12th of this year. On



average, 15+ family units use the diaper bank each week. Most popular sizes are 4,5,6, but smaller sizes are also needed as the bank grows. Checks to the PDF are encouraged due to storage limitations.
