

FROM THE MODERATOR

For those who were in attendance at our church service on Sunday, September 23rd, and the informational meeting following the service, you know that the candidate that the search committee had chosen for our settled minister has decided not to take the position. I have included a copy of the letter that was sent to the congregation for those who may not have received it.

“Dear First Parish Members and Friends,

I am writing to share important news about our current search for a settled minister, its status as well as renewed plans for the future.

Over the past 16 months the search committee has been prayerfully working to find our next settled minister. They have received and reviewed 37 profiles from prospective candidates. From those profiles a number of candidates were interviewed either by skype or by in-person meetings and their selection was narrowed down to four candidates. Of those four candidates, two were asked to officiate at a neutral pulpit where the search committee could witness how they prepared and performed during an actual church service. A final candidate was unanimously chosen to be our settled minister.

After several rounds of negotiation, a financial agreement could not be reached, and the chosen candidate has withdrawn their name from consideration. According to the Maine Conference it is not uncommon for a chosen candidate to withdraw following unsuccessful negotiations regarding the details of the call agreement. We recognize all the hard work and dedication the search committee has expended, and we sincerely thank them for their efforts.

Over the past several weeks the council has met with the search committee, with the Conference Minister, Deborah Blood and held executive sessions. As a result of these meetings, the council has come to the following conclusions:

1. Based on recommendations of Reverend Blood and the wishes of several of the search committee members, the present search committee will be discharged of their duties.
2. Reverend Breault has been asked by the council (and has agreed) to continue on as our interim minister.
3. A new search committee has been chosen by the council.
4. Important Information gathered by the existing search committee will be passed on to the new search committee for their review and the developed profile will be reviewed and modified if necessary. In addition to the previous information gathered , the congregation will be asked to participate in additional visioning meetings to insure that the profile reflects the true picture of the church as it is today and where it wants to be in the future.

The following is a time line for our next steps:

Sunday, September 23

During the church service the existing search committee will be recognized and celebrated for their exhaustive work over the past 16 months, and then will be formerly discharged of their duties.

Following the service, a gathering of those interested members and friends of First Parish will be held in the sanctuary to hear in more detail the events that occurred and our steps forward. The new search committee will be introduced at that time.

In the following weeks:

The council will meet with Reverend Breault and then the congregation, to determine our collective goals and identify opportunities for improved dialogue between ministry teams and the congregation. We will also reflect on and address any persisting challenges that could prevent our church from being prepared to accept and welcome a new settled minister.


I look forward to the coming weeks to see First Parish become more than just the "Church on the Corner", but a real beacon of hope and love to share and a truly open and affirming church where all are welcome."

As mentioned above, following the service an informational meeting was held to further explain the issues. Many people had questions regarding the search process and several members of the search committee discussed their feelings regarding this process. Notes were taken during the meeting and those issues and concerns will be shared with the new search committee which has been selected by the council. The new members of the search committee include Jamie Beals, Eric Steva, Pam Mohlin, Heather Galasyn, Sue Martin, Dale Siulinski and Phil Blood. An initial meeting was held with the new search committee, Rev. Breault and Rev. Blood from the Maine UCC after church on September 30th. At that time all of the work of the first search committee and the most recent feedback was shared with the new committee to make plans for the upcoming months. I know that you will all join me in wishing them a successful beginning to the next chapter in our interim journey.

From Deborah's Desk

A few summers ago, I had the pleasure of visiting Crater Lake National Park in southern Oregon. It is an absolutely amazing natural wonder. While there I learned many things about the Lake and the surrounding area. For example, I learned that Crater Lake is actually not a crater, but is in fact, a Caldera. I learned the circumference of the rim and the elevation from the top of the rim to the lake and from the surface of the water to the bottom of the lake. Did you know that Crater Lake is the deepest lake in the United States and the ninth deepest lake in the world? All true. But of all the things that fascinated me about this stunning lake is the color. The brilliant blue color of the lake is quite unique and here is the reason for it.

The magnificent intense blue of Crater Lake is due to its great depth and clarity. Sunlight is able to penetrate deep into the water. The depth absorbs many of the longer rays and reflecting the shorter rays of the white light spectrum. Red light is the longest wavelength, thus gets absorbed.

I was only there for a brief weekend but I did get to take a boat ride around the lake, which was narrated by a member of the National Park Service. Of all the things I learned that day it was the final statement from the Park Ranger that gave me the greatest clarity and awareness. He said, "the Forest Service is not here to preserve what Crater Lake is, but to preserve the changes of what it can become."

It is the same with our interim journey. Our current job is not to preserve what this church has become. (And there is no doubt it is a wonderful community of faith!) But *it is* our job to preserve the sacred space and mystery of this place for the changes of what *this faith community has yet to become*. We are very blessed and continue to move forward as we grow and change into the new thing that God is doing in this place. Thanks be to God.





Our Church school classes are going very well. If you have registered but




haven't been able to make it to church yet, we certainly look forward to seeing you soon. We realize that there are great demands on everyone's time these days and we hope to see many of you in the near future.

Mission Opportunities...In Our Own Backyard



Did you know that just a couple hours of your time can make a real difference in someone's life? The Mission Team would like you to know about two opportunities for service to those on the edges of society that require no special skills, and the only tools required are willing hands and an open heart.

The first is at Bon Appetit, a meal program run out of Second Congregational Church in Biddeford. Volunteers arrive at 4:20 p.m. to help prepare and serve meals. The work is complete by 6 p.m. This meal makes a big difference in the lives of those in our neighborhoods living in constant food insecurity. First Parish serves on the second Monday and fourth Friday of each month, and volunteers are always needed.

The second is at the Paul Hazleton senior residencies in Saco, located just behind the Rite-Aid on Route 1. There are two units in the Paul Hazleton complex, and First Parish has been preparing a breakfast for the residents of Paul Hazleton 2 on the third Saturday of alternate months for several years. The food is supplied by the United Way - all that is required are folks who can help prepare and/or serve the meal. Volunteers show up at 8 a.m., breakfast is served at 9:00, and typically the cleanup is completed by 10 a.m. The next meal is scheduled for October 20th.

If either of these sound like something you could do, then why not give it a try? It may be a life-changing experience!

Eleven volunteers from York County made their way to Seacoast Missions in Cherryfield this year and First Parish sent 4 folks: Diane Simonds, Trina Triggs, and Rick and Nancy Twomey. We enjoyed bringing food to share with The Table of Plenty (community meal served every Sunday) and meeting the local characters. Several members on the team were new this year and wondered what we would be doing for projects, and they quickly found themselves with experienced team leaders who guided them and helped them learn new skills to complete the jobs. A rewarding experience for all those who attended.

Projects we took part in were:

Rehabbing and putting new insulation and skirting around a 70' trailer so the pipes won't freeze again this year. A small door was made in the skirting for easy access to allow maintenance beneath the trailer.


Removing carpeting and the padding in a living room and hallway, replaced it with a floating floor and replacing the molding and baseboards. This was a very challenging job because it was in a small area with 4 people working in a confined area.

Another project involved making 3 framed gates to replace broken ones on a large deck.

We also helped form a bucket line with many of the recipients to unload food items from The Good Shepherd Food Bank into a large storage area where they can get food items as part of the community services provided by Seacoast Missions.

First Parish also donated 2 prayer shawls, 4 lap blankets, several pairs of mittens, hats and scarfs. Thank you!


